

## **PRESIDENTIAL PROCLAMATION NO. 13-00**

Regarding the Death of the Late Former Ngarchelong State Governor  
Rudimch Jack Titiml

WHEREAS, on October 26, 2000 at 10:30 p.m., Palau time, after a lifetime of devotion and commitment to the people of the State of Ngarchelong and the Republic of Palau, the late Rudimch J. Titiml was called to his eternal rest, and

WHEREAS, the late Rudimch J. Titiml was born on August 18, 1945 to Dr. Lomisang Ngirailild (deceased) and Mrs. Isau Titiml Renguul and adopted by Mr. Titiml Skobetang and Mrs. Aliil Titiml; and

WHEREAS, the late Rudimch J. Titiml attended and graduated from Ngarchelong Elementary School, Intermediate School in Koror, George Washington High School in Guam, and Hawaii Pacific College; and

WHEREAS, while seeking overseas education in Honolulu, the late Rudimch J. Titiml served as Treasurer of the Micronesian Students Association and as President of the Palau Students Association; and

WHEREAS, the late Rudimch J. Titiml served as the Chief of the Division of Transportation during the U.S. Trust Territory administration of Palau; and

WHEREAS, in the middle 1970s, the late Rudimch J. Titiml, with his good character and working morale, served as General Manager for Mobil Oil Branches in Saipan, Pohnpei, and Palau; and

WHEREAS, the late Rudimch J. Titiml, having formed and owned Belau Music Company (BMC), Nanyo Ocean Bar & Restaurant, and Happy Landing (Arkemais), was one of the successful and distinguished businessman in Palau; and

WHEREAS, the late Rudimch J. Titiml, in 1982, was elected to the First Ngarchelong State Assembly and served as a distinguished Speaker until 1984; and

WHEREAS, in 1984, the former Ngarchelong State Legislator, Rudimch J. Titiml, was re-elected and served an additional four years term as a Ngarchelong State Assembly member; and

WHEREAS, the late Rudimch J. Titiml was elected as the Governor of Ngarchelong State from 1994 to 1998; and

WHEREAS, the former Ngarchelong State Governor Rudimch J. Titiml, was known as an active supporter of the Ngarchelong State youths; and

WHEREAS, the late entrepreneur Rudimch J. Titiml served as President of EURASIA Pacific Inc.; and

WHEREAS, the late Rudimch J. Titiml also served as President of the Palau Industrial Corporation (PIC); and

WHEREAS, the late Rudimch J. Titiml held the traditional title of "Odaolraiksang" of Ngeungel Hamlet, Ngarchelong; and

WHEREAS, the late Rudimch J. Titiml is survived by his wife - Serafina Salvador Titiml; children - Jeffrey Titiml, Ida Reko Killcullen, Kevin Adachi, Steven Titiml, Dora B. Joseph, Jesse Imetengel, Kendall West Titiml, Eleanor Ngirchelei Titiml; grandchildren - Sean Killcullen, Krista Bolei Titiml; step-father - Iyechadrairikl Renguul Kloulechad; sisters - Maria Ngirmidol, Jelina Renguul, Junita Rengiil (deceased), Mirang Higa, Jennifer Renguul; brothers - Sanders Kloulechad, Robinson Kloulechad, Harvey Renguul, Godinez Renguul, Dean "Conrad" Renguul; and numerous nephews, nieces, and cousins.

NOW, THEREFORE, by virtue of the authority vested in me under the Constitution and the laws of the Republic of Palau and by the provisions of 1 PNC 503(c) and of Executive Order No. 24, as amended, I, Kuniwo Nakamura, President of the Republic of Palau, hereby proclaim that a state of national mourning shall be observed throughout the Republic as a tribute to the late Rudimch J. Titiml and that to properly observe the occasion of the death of this very distinguished public servant, all flags regularly flown within the jurisdiction of Palau, and the national flags of the Republic of Palau flown at embassies, consulates and offices of Palau in other countries, shall be flown at half-mast for a period of five (5) days commencing on October 28, 2000, and ending on November 02, 2000.
